

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DIPLOMA OF BUSINESS

Overview

The Diploma of Business is a uniquely positioned, higher education Diploma designed for those who are seeking to develop practical skills to succeed in business, while developing the knowledge and academic skills necessary to succeed in further study at University.

The Diploma provides an alternative to the first year of a Bachelor of Business as well as providing valuable business acumen and skills for those seeking to enter or re-enter the workforce, start your own business or innovate within an existing business.

You will complete 8 foundation business discipline subjects including business communication, management, marketing, data analysis, economics, accounting and law. These core disciplines are contextualised using a virtual business, providing students with an opportunity to understand how these concepts apply in a contemporary Small to Medium-sized Enterprise (SME). This application ensures the course is relevant, and that students acquire both a theoretical understanding of the disciplines as well as tangible skills which can be immediately applied in a workplace setting.

You will also develop important generic skills required to succeed both in university study and a global business environment including academic and digital literacy, numeracy, critical thinking, analytical evaluation, independent learning and working collaboratively. RBS graduates will also have developed entrepreneurial intelligence and the ability to execute – skills which characterise The Sarina Russo Group and are needed in the current and future workforce.

Course Structure

The RBS Model

RBS has developed a distinctive model that sets us apart from other Higher Education providers.

The 8 Diploma of Business subjects are grouped into 4 clusters bringing together complementary disciplines to emphasise the inter-connectedness of foundation business concepts and how these apply in a business setting.

- Professional Skills for Business
- Managing and Marketing a Business
- Data Analytics and Decision Making for Business
- Finance and Legal Essentials for Business

Each Cluster is delivered over a 6-week period followed by a 2-week break*. This model allows you to focus on specific discipline areas over a concentrated period, while also providing flexible entry and exit points for those needing to balance your study with other commitments.

If you complete the 4 clusters on a full-time program, you can complete the Diploma within 8 months and fast track the completion of a Bachelor of Business at James Cook University, through a seamless transition process.

You are encouraged to complete both subjects in the cluster (a full-time load), however part-time options are available with students completing just 1 subject at a time.

Delivery Format

A flexible approach to learning

We realise that students have complex lives and need flexibility, so have designed the course to provide as much flexibility as possible.

Option to blend online and on-campus learning

- International students have the option to commence their studies online at home through our digital campus and then transfer to Australia to complete their diploma resulting in no lost time.
- Australian students can choose to study online, face-to-face or a mixture of both.

Online only

• Complete the course 100% online at home if this is the best fit for your circumstances.

Flexible study patterns

- Subjects are taught over a six-week period to provide opportunities for entry and exit points.
- There are six terms per year, allowing you to either fast-track your study and complete in 8 months or spread your study out over the year.

Work-life balance

• You are generally only required to attend classes over three days providing the flexibility to manage work and personal commitments.

Cluster 1

Professional Skills for Business

This cluster focuses on preparing you to contribute effectively in a business environment while also developing the vital academic skills needed to succeed in the university-level study. You will develop skills in professional business communication (spoken, written, in-person and electronic) including leadership, teamwork, problem-solving, digital literacy, initiative and enterprise skills that are most sought by employers to work effectively in a business environment.

You will gain a broad overview of the management functions within an organisation, with a focus on planning, organising, leading and effectively managing a team to peak business performance. You will also gain an understanding of the marketing role in modern organisations including the marketing mix, customer segmentation, products, pricing, placement, advertising, selling and digital marketing. You will harness your marketing skills; learning how to build a business brand, connect and engage with your customers.







Cluster 3 Data Analytics & Decision Making for Business

» RH1007 Data Analysis & Management» RH1003 Economics

You will be introduced to the basic statistical methods that are widely used in modern business applications. Our aim is to equip you with the essential knowledge and skills to interpret and forecast real-world data in a business context. You will also be introduced to basic economic concepts and theories including microeconomics, focusing on decision making of individual customers and firms (e.g. customers' decisions on consumption, and firms' decisions on production) and macroeconomics, which addresses economic issues at an aggregate level (e.g. international trading, interest rates, taxes and government spending). You will develop data analytics and problem-solving skills to make informed decisions to respond to complex business challenges.

Cluster 4 Finance and Legal Essentials for Business

» RH1002 Accounting
» RH1012 Business Law

This cluster is designed to provide you with a basic understanding of accounting issues both in Australia and internationally. It covers accounting standards and concepts, elements of financial statements, recognition criteria, alternative methods of valuation and reporting, and disclosure of the financial performance of companies. You will learn how the financial world works and make smart business decisions. You are also introduced to the Australian legal system, and the legal rules regulating commercial activities in Australia. A substantial amount of time is dedicated to explaining the law of contract, relevant to most commercial exchanges of goods and services. You will acquire the skills to understand the important role that finance and law plays in business decision-making.



Domestic Students FEE-HELP

You pay back your FEE-HELP debt through the tax system once you earn above the compulsory repayment threshold. The compulsory repayment threshold may change from year to year.

Recent School Leavers

If you have completed year 12 within the last 5 years and obtained either a Pass in at least 3 subjects or an ATAR 50 you will be eligible to enter the Diploma of Business.

Vocational Education and Training (VET) Graduates

If you have completed a Certificate III or higher through a Registered Training Organisation within the last 5 years you will be eligible to enter the Diploma of Business.

All other applicants

If your qualification is less more than 5 years old or you did not complete Year 12, your eligibility can be assessed based on your work experience. Please provide the following information with your application:

- A detailed overview of your education and employment history including paid and unpaid work (i.e. your resume)
- Evidence of your work experience this can be written statements from previous employer/s, group certificate, or the names and contact details of referees who can be contacted.
- A short personal statement (300-500 words) outlining why you wish to study at RBS, what you are looking for out of the course and your career goals.

All applicants are required to apply directly to RBS using the appropriate Application Form (refer pages 23-26 or available at *rbs.qld.edu. au*) and attaching certified copies of their qualifications and other documentation as specified.

English Learning Requirements

Students whose native language is not English must demonstrate proficiency by achieving a minimum score in a reliable, high-stakes English Language Proficiency test. We will accept the following test results (achieved within the previous 2 years) as proof of English proficiency.

Alternatively, students who have successfully completed 2 years of full-time study where the language of instruction was English, may satisfy the English requirement. This study must have been undertaken no more than 2 years prior to the date on your RBS Letter of Offer. In addition, students must provide a certificate or statement confirming this from the Registrar's office where the student studied.

Please note: The Department of Home Affairs may require evidence of English language proficiency as part of a student visa application. Students should check acceptable forms of evidence on their website.

Students from high risk countries may need to provide evidence that they have obtained a certain test score in an English test language approved by the Department of Home Affairs (DHA) or fall into an exemption category at the time they submit their visa application.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION Australian Visa Information

Streamlined visa processing

Home Affairs must be satisfied that you are a Genuine Temporary Entrant, that your primary purpose for coming to Australia is to study and that you are a genuine student. You must meet Home Affairs' health and character requirements, and Home Affairs will also require you to declare that you have sufficient funds to pay your tuition fees and support yourself for the duration of your course.

Working as a student

Under Australian immigration regulations, students on a student visa may work up to 40 hours per fortnight during university teaching periods and without restriction during university vacations.

Permission to work in Australia will be automatically included when you are granted your student visa.

Working rights for your partner

If your spouse is joining you, he or she can also work while you are studying in Australia by applying for a permission to work visa. The work conditions for your spouse will vary depending on the degree you are studying.

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)

You are required to organise private health insurance before coming to study in Australia. Private health insurance must then be maintained for the duration of your studies. Norwegian and Swedish citizens do not require OSHC. OSHC is a requirement for student Visa holders only. You may arrange your own OSHC or have our team arrange it on your behalf. Fees vary depending on the length of the student visa and are subject to change. Students with a spouse and/or other dependants are required to pay a higher premium.

Bringing your family

Your spouse and children can join you in Australia but each family member must be added to the student visa application, and certain conditions will apply depending on the age of each member.

If you have children who will be attending school while in Australia, you will have to pay school fees for them.

Deferral, temporary suspension or cancellation of enrolment

The ESOS National Code and student visa conditions contain restrictions on when you, or RBS, can defer, suspend or cancel your enrolment. You may only defer commencement of your study or take a leave of absence once you have commenced when there are "compassionate or compelling" reasons for doing so. A "compassionate or compelling" reason is something which is beyond your control and which has, or will have, an impact on your academic progress or wellbeing. We may suspend a student temporarily, enforcing a break from study, in certain circumstances. For details of those circumstances, and more information on deferral, suspension and cancellation, see the Deferral, Suspension and Cancellation of Study Guidelines (rbs.qld.edu.au) for students and applicants who hold international student visas on our website.

ESOS Act and Tuition Protection Service

As a provider of education services to international students in Australia, we are required to comply with the Education Services for Overseas Students Act (ESOS Act) and the National Code of Practice for Registration Authorities and Providers of Education and Training to Overseas Students (The National Code). The ESOS legislation and National Code specify minimum standards for the delivery of courses to students in Australia studying on a student visa and regulate what information must be given to existing and prospective international students, what support must be provided to existing students, what records are kept and what information is to be given to government agencies about international students. Our Student Fee Policy applies to overseas students who do not commence their studies at RBS, or withdraw before their course is completed. The Tuition Protection Service (TPS) is a placement and refund service for international students studying on a student visa which also operates under the ESOS Act. The TPS replaces the Tuition Assurance Scheme and the ESOS Assurance Fund. On the rare occasions that a provider is unable to deliver a course an international student has paid for and does not meet its legal obligations to make alternative course replacements or provide a refund, the TPS will assist students to find an alternative place or, if this is not possible, provide a refund of any unspent tuition fees.

How you will be assessed

We have a variety of assessment methods that apply to our courses. These include reports, essays, oral presentations, group projects, assignments, quizzes, examinations, class participation, and workshops. Details of assessments for particular courses are available at the subject level from our website.

Mode of delivery

Subjects are timetabled across the study periods. If you are an international students on student visa , you must attend each study period and enrol in 2 subjects per study period.

Registration and Orientation Day

Registration and Orientation is a celebration for students commencing their studies at RBS. It is an excellent opportunity to meet lecturing staff and make friends upon arriving in Brisbane or commencing your course online.

Registration and Orientation at RBS are compulsory for all newly on Campus Students to attend. This day is spent ensuring you are correctly registered and enrolled in your program and receive your student card and student login, so you can start your chosen course and subjects on time.

For most students, this week is usually the first experience of life beyond high school in a new country, and for this reason, Registration and Orientation at RBS has been carefully planned to ensure students have a smooth transition into Australian studies and campus life, enhancing the student experience.

If you are an international student, make sure that you take these dates into consideration when booking your flights to Brisbane. If you are studying online, this program is also delivered online.

A detailed schedule for Registration and Orientation week is usually made available on our website, a month before the start of a study period.

Step 1

Email your completed application form with all supporting documentation, including certified academic transcripts and IELTS/ TOEFL/Pearson (PTE Academic) scores (if required), to RBS at **info@rbs.qld.edu.au**.

Please indicate on your application form if you wish to be considered for recognition of prior learning.

NOTE: If documentation is in a language other than English, an official certified translation must be included and translated by the issuing organisation or by an official translating service.

Step 2

Your application will be assessed against entry requirements for your preferred course.

Step 3

If your application is successful, we will generate an electronic letter of offer which you will receive by email. The letter of offer includes:

- Your name and duration of the course you have been accepted
- Any credit you have been awarded for previous study
- Tuition fees and other costs
- Links to relevant information

For International Students only

Step 4

Once you have received your letter of offer, please ensure that all conditions in your offer schedule have been met. Complete and sign the acceptance and payment agreement and return it to RBS or our overseas representative, along with the advance deposit required.

Step 5

An electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE) will be issued. This is the document you will need to obtain a student visa for Australia. More details will be provided upon acceptance of your offer.

Step 6

Use your eCoE to obtain a student visa from your nearest Embassy or Consulate in your home country.

NOTE: Visa applications can take up to 3 months or more to process depending on your nationality and the country from which you are applying.

Step 7

Once you have a student visa, you are ready to begin your study.
